This triumphant work is a ground breaking window into Sudan's often overlooked contributions to the culinary arts, made accessible with easy-to-find ingredients, helpful hints, and alternative recipes for most modern diets, such as veganism. In light of the recent upheaval experienced throughout Sudan, steeped in decades of oppression, The Sudanese Kitchen is a defiant representation of the country's rich cultural diversity.
