### INTRODUCTION

Since its inception in 2021, Almas Art Foundation has been passionate about delivering a public program of projects, doing justice to the depth and talent of the outstanding artists we have worked with. Our mission has been to document and present these seminal art practices, to contextualise them, and to recognise educational institutions and creative practitioners in each location. As the commercial interest in African contemporary visual arts is growing, we believe the whole art ecosystem needs further support and platforms to inspire a future generation of creatives. To this end, a key component of our mission has been making our exhibitions, publications and documentaries available to the public as well as distributing our print publications to educational institutions and public art spaces in Africa free of charge.

We started 2023 with the screenings of the acclaimed Nigerian film by director Akin Omatoso, The Ghost and The House of Truth. April saw our first exhibition, Embodying Social Being, featuring works by Ugandan artist Dr Lilian Nabulime. In September, we hosted the Lagos based artist Gerald Chukwuma in conversation with journalist Bola Mosura at the Africa Centre to mark the launch of the publication Together Together and Chukwuma's documentary. In October, we had the privilege of delivering projects featuring the Egyptian artist Souad Abdelrasoul. Like a Single Pomegranate was our first dual-language publication. This was followed by a collaboration with Kayd Somali Week to sponsor the screenings of Ahmed Farah's AYAANLE.

We finished the year on a high with the exhibition, Social Game, at the Africa Centre featuring Cameroonian artist Salifou Lindou Fouanta.

The institutional and public support, and enthusiasm we received throughout this year has been moving. Our community of artists, audiences and collaborators grows with each project, which has been rewarding for the Almas team. We look forward to delivering another year of exciting projects in 2024. Until then, we invite you to connect with us and explore our films and publications on the Almas website.

Born in Kampala, Uganda, Dr Nabulime trained at the Margaret Trowell School of Industrial and Fine Art (MTSIFA) at Makerere University. She obtained her PhD at Newcastle University with her dissertation, "The Role of Sculptural Forms as a Communication Tool in Relation to the Lives and Experiences of Women with HIV/AIDS in Uganda." She currently lives and works in Kampala, Uganda and is a senior lecturer at Makerere University alongside her busy studio practice. She has taught and mentored multiple generations of Ugandan artists.

Since the 1990s, Dr Nabulime has built a body of work recording the societal pressures and their effects on women and children that is unique in its honesty and tenderness. Describing herself as a 'social being' continuously affected by the events faced by her community, her practice offers a subjective registry of these events, the ensuing emotions and pressures, always with a look to empowering her subjects. Through her work, Dr Nabulime often delves into themes such as familial and social relations, taboos, stigmas around HIV infections and experiences of young women on campus. Dr Nabulime's works often juxtapose reclaimed monumental tree parts and roots with found and recycled materials such as soda cans, chains and plastic. Reclamation, recycling and working with found objects crafted by local artisans have been fundamental to her practice, allowing her to fold the stories behind these objects and their symbolisms into her works.

Almas Art Foundation organised an exhibition of works of Dr Lilian Nabulime in the G16 space in the New Wing of Somerset House, which was open to the public for a week as well as a preview event.



Gerald Chukwuma (b. 1973) lives and works in Lagos, Nigeria. He graduated in 2003 with First Class Honours from the University of Nigeria, Nsukka. Chukwuma is one of Nigeria's fastest rising contemporary artists, noted for his intricately crafted sculptures on wood panels.

The materials he chooses are common enough; however, using in his unique way a range of techniques — including burning, chiselling and painting — he captures a richly layered history that is imbedded with personal and political meanina.

The use of traditional Uli and Nsibidi symbols links his work to the Nsukka art tradition which is credited with expanding and modernising the Igbo cultural aesthetic. Meanwhile, the transformation of found objects into highly detailed artworks roots him firmly in the contemporary moment, with its concern for rapid environmental and ecological change.

Almas Art Foundation hosted a book and film launch for Gerald Chukwuma at the Africa Centre. The book launch saw Gerald Chukwuma in conversation with journalist Bola Mosuro and was attended by members of the public and art professionals. The publication, the documentary film and the filmed conversation between Gerald Chukwuma and Bola Mosura are available on Almas Art Foundation website and YouTube Channel.

Souad Abdelrasoul's paintings exalt in the feminine and the emotional. They explore the idea of the modern woman, informed by her own experiences of being a woman in a patriarchal society. Reflecting on her experiences as a mother, Abdelrasoul draws attention to the ways women evolve and adapt in oppressive environments. Often using familiar myths and legends, she paints stories through her figures that question the roles women hold in society and cultural history in disruptive and thought-provoking ways.

By reconceptualizing perceptions of space, she repurposes notions of form, science and nature into strikingly personal configurations. Working between the abstract and figurative, she intertwines human, animal and vegetal forms, believing we are all intrinsically connected to the earth. Tree-like figures with branching veins and arteries and giant insect-like creatures merge on her canvases to remind the viewer of the vital bond between our internal lives and the exterior world we live in.

Abdelrasoul graduated with a BFA in 1998 from Minia University and in 2005 completed her master's degree in History of Art. In 2012, she completed her PhD in Modern Art History.

Almas Art Foundation organised an exhibition of works by Souad Abdelrasoul, curated by Sahar Behairy during the week of 1-54 Art Fair and Frieze London. We were pleased to host SOAS students alongside Dr Polly Savage for a private visit and Q&A with Souad Abdelrasoul and Sahar Behairy.

Salifou Lindou's practice reflects the human desire and struggle to live with dignity in the face of societal and political pressures. Scheming corrupt politicians and families torn by emigration emerge out of spontaneous, energetic lines that express both the vulnerability and the power of human bodies, capturing the impulses and reactions that mark their daily struggles. Similarly, daily scenes with neighbours engaged in lively conversation or children engrossed in their games reflect the moments of connection and community. Salifou Lindou is a keen supporter and mentor to the younger generation of artists in Douala.

A self-taught artist, Salifou Lindou has experimented with a wide range of materials, including metal, leather and paper, and produced complex installations and performances throughout his career. He is a founding member of the Kapsiki Circle, whose performances, projects, and interventions transformed the art scene in Douala in the late 90s. By bringing art to the streets and the public, the Kapsiki Circle firmly established art as an agent of political commentary and social change.

Almas Art Foundation organised an exhibition of works by Salifou Lindou Fouanta at the Africa Centre. Students from the Westminster School's African and Caribbean Society visited the exhibition to meet Salifou Lindou Fouanta and the Africa Centre director Olu Alake.

FILM SCREENING - THE GHOST AND THE HOUSE OF TRUTH






Almas proudly hosted the UK premiere of "The Ghost and The House of Truth," a compelling film directed by Akin Omotoso, at Courthouse Hotel Cinema during January 2023.

The film masterfully unfolds the harrowing story of Bola Ogun, a dedicated counsellor, who facilitates reconciliation services between convicts and the victims of their crimes. Her steadfast belief in forgiveness and her trust in the system is severely tested when her own daughter mysteriously disappears.

The screenings were attended by 400 members of the public.

#### KAYD SOMALI WEEK SCREENINGS OF AYAANLE. A FILM BY AHMED FARAH.

Almas Art Foundation sponsored screenings of AYAANLE during the KAYD Somali Week in October 2023 at the Courthouse Hotel in London.

AYAANLE is a 21-year-old young man, living in Nairobi, who aspires to become an actor like Denzel Washington and reach Hollywood. Despite his conservative upbringing and coming from an impoverished background, he remains optimistic about making it in the film industry. His life turns upside down after a series of unlikely events that led him to becoming the most wanted man in Kenya.

The screenings were attended by 300 members of the public and the ticket sales benefited KAYD's program of cultural events. Almas also organised a premier of the film at the Somerset House followed by a Q&A with the director Ahmed Farah and journalist Mary Harper.

#### VIRTUAL ARTISTS' TALK DR LILIAN NABULIME, MARTHA KAZUNGU AND DR POLLY SAVAGE OF SOAS, LONDON.


#### AFRICA CENTRE





## LOOKING INTO 2024 PROJECTS

We are working to deliver exciting projects again in 2024 as well as making advances in fundraising towards the future self-reliance of Almas Art Foundation. Alongside the artists projects, Almas will again be looking to sponsor screenings of acclaimed feature films. We are delighted to announce the artists we are aiming to work with in 2024:

Andile Dyalvane is guided by a deep spiritual connection to his Xhosa ancestors. His medium of clay or "umhlaba" (mother earth) is, at its most fundamental, a life-affirming connection to the soil. Dyalvane completed a National Diploma in Art and Design at Sivuyile Technical College in Gugulethu, Cape Town, followed by a National Diploma in Ceramic Design from Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University in 2003.

In 2005, he and Zizipho Poswa co-founded Imiso Ceramics. He has developed a language of incision marks inspired by the ancient African tradition of body scarification.

Project Launch Date: February 2024

Born 1971 in Nyeri, Richard Kamathi studied Graphic Arts at the Nairobi Creative Art Centre. In 1996, he joined the artists' incubator Kuona Trust studios. Kimathi's work represents the human tendencies, how we feel and behave in political and social situations. Kimathi has represented Kenya at Dak'Art in Senegal, has taken part in the Kenya pavilion in 2017.

Project Launch Date: April 2024

Ermias Ekube (b. 1970, Addis Ababa, Ethiopia) studied at the Addis Ababa School of Fine arts and Design, graduating in 1990. He lives and works in Kalmar, Sweden. Merging figurative and conceptual strands, Ekube's work draws on thoughts and memories to imbue stories with meaning via simple objects, signs and gestures.
